

EAR WAX REMOVAL

WHAT IS EAR WAX

Earwax is a build-up of dead cells, hair, foreign material such as dust, and cerumen. Cerumen is the natural wax. It is a protective coating for the ear canal. Small amounts are made all the time and are necessary to keep the ear clean. The quantity of earwax made varies greatly from person to person. Impacted wax may cause a feeling of fullness and dulled hearing. It can feel uncomfortable. A plug of earwax is not a serious problem, more a nuisance.

1. EAR DROPS

Ear drops alone will often clear a plug of earwax. You can buy drops from pharmacies, for example, olive oil, almond oil, and sodium bicarbonate. Warm the drops to room temperature before using them. Lie with the affected ear uppermost and pour a few drops into the affected ear. Stay like this for 2-3 minutes to allow the earwax to soak into the wax and soften it.

Repeat this 2-3 times a day for 7-10 days. Flakes or crusts of earwax often fall out bit by bit. You may not notice the wax as it comes out of your ear.

2. HOME EAR SYRINGING BULB

You can buy an ear syringing bulb from the pharmacy or online for between £1 and £5. The bulb may only work if the plug of earwax has been softened.

Therefore, always start with step 1. Above - Ear Drops. Fill the bulb with warm water. Lean over a sink or bowl. Place the nozzle of the bulb gently at the opening of the ear, not deep inside, and squeeze the warm water

In line with many other practices locally and nationally the team at the surgery has taken the decision to cease offering ear irrigation at the practice. There are a number of reasons for this including:

- There are suitable safe and effective alternatives that allow patients to self-care at home. Although the risk associated with irrigation is low there is still a chance of complications occurring such as perforated ear drum, middle ear infection & external canal infection
- There are a number of places that offer this service – the details of these can be found on our website or please see the reverse. If you have any queries, please speak to a member of our reception team
- If you are in any doubt regarding the cause of your symptoms, please contact reception and we'll happily arrange to see you for an assessment and advise you on the most appropriate treatment.

**** Do not try to clean the ear canal with cotton wool buds. This can make things worse, as you will push some earwax deeper inside. It may also cause an ear infection. Rather, let the ear clean itself**

**** If you experience significant pain or discharge see your nurse or GP**

into the ear canal. As the water runs out it should carry the wax with it. Repeat 5-10 times. This can be repeated daily for 3 days.
